motion by D. Pyland and sec. by D. Byars.




Rae Lynne explained the Porterville Reads program will be celebrating its 20th anniversary on April 13th at Vets. Park and asked for volunteers.

So again: Thanks So Much for the Quilt, Sgt Charles Lang Spann: USAF 823 Redhorse, Vietnam 1969 and 1971. Lived in Porterville from 1977 to 1989 working for the Forest Service."

Editor's Tip of the Month

In my advanced age and weakened condition, I have a bit of trouble holding the ruler still for long cuts without slipping. I hate to waste fabric due to irregular cutting! I learned a simple trick from the Jordan Fabric Tutorials

(https://jordanfabrics.com).

Take a 5 or 8 lb weight and place one end on the ruler and one end on the mat. The weight acts as a third "hand" and keeps the ruler in place while cutting. A weight with flat edges and has a rubber-like surface works best.



When you are done you can do some bicep curls. Ha Ha.


