June Workshop ~ Making Little Quilts!

We had a great turnout for the Little Quilts Workshop!

There were members sewing, cutting, pressing and so forth!

Quick Tip—Use a brow trimmer to rip out stitches!

This was a new one for me. First, I didn't know these brow trimmers existed (because I have hardly any eye-brows and don't dare trim them or I'd look really funny). Second, I didn't know any other way to remove stitches except using the seam ripper.

These little trimmers are inexpensive and reportedly work well, especially when ripping out seams with small stitch lengths, such as with paper piecing (I watched a You Tube). You just draw them along the seam repeatedly being careful not to cut your fabric. Evidently the electric ones work well, too.

I have heard they are easy to get a dollar type stores, but also other outlets. I'm going to try it!

nity to buy some wonderful items.




