

Meeting Minutes, August 17, 2023

President Sue Riley called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m., followed by the flag salute.

Welcome/Sunshine: Jan reported we had 47 members and 2 guests present. We sang Happy Birthday to Sally, Sandra, Darlene B., Connie, Karen A., Shirley W., Carlie, and Terry.

Recording Secretary: The minutes from the July 20 meeting were published in the newsletter. A correction was made regarding Harvest Bounty - there will be no 50/50. A motion by Georgeanne Borjon and seconded by Phyllis Taylor to accept the minutes as corrected was passed.

Corresponding Secretary: Diana reported we received a thank you note from Haley Vallier, our 2023 scholarship winner, and an invitation to the Common Threads Quilt Show in Hanford on Sept. 30.

Treasurer's Report: July Income - \$459.32 Expenses - \$257.82 Register Balance - \$13,827.63

A motion by Lynette Stover and seconded by Adella Rapp to accept the treasurer's report was passed.

VP/Programs/Workshops: Janet shared the following -

*September 21/Harvest Bounty - All proceeds will go to the Club. Janet had bid slips available and one was printed in the newsletter for copying.

*October 19 - Barbara Daniels will give a lecture on thread painting and hold a workshop the next day, October 20 (\$30).

Program: Terry Gomez displayed her many beautiful rope baskets and explained how they are made with different techniques ("very easy"). She took classes at AVS in Fresno and also learned by watching YouTube videos. Thirteen signed up for

the workshop on Friday. Thank you, Terry, your baskets were a hit!

Block of the Month - Sheri demonstrated her Louisiana block which she found on the Quilter's Cache (lots of free patterns!). Diana McKay won the July BOM (after Sue drew her own name - again!). Della reminded everyone that BOM patterns are 25 cents, and past winners will have a show & tell in January of their completed BOM quilts.

Proposed Bylaws - Priscilla Summers went over the Proposed May 12, 2023, Porterville Quilters Bylaws asking, on each Article/Section proposed change, if anyone had questions or comments. On Article III: Membership, Section 45, after discussion, "honorary members" was changed to "Charter members". There were no other changes to the Proposed Bylaws. A motion was made by Becki Eaton to accept the Proposed Bylaws as presented and corrected; Georgeanne Borjon seconded the motion. There was no discussion and the motion passed. During the presentation on Article VIII: Committees, Sue Marcotte, the

Club's Ombudsman (an appointed position), explained her duties as a go-between for members who have complaints. **THANK YOU** to Margaret, Doris and Priscilla who took on the task of updating our Bylaws!

Next Board Meeting: August 29, 2023, Pizza Factory - 11:00 a.m.




