Program: Janet introduced Dr. Susan Geringer, retired

Department Chair of Marketing & Logistics and a professor at Fresno State, who currently lives on a ranch in Madera. Dr. Geringer has studied the Amish for over 35 years and has been able to live with an Amish family at least twice a year for up to two weeks at a time since 2016. She said most of what we see on TV or read about the Amish isn't true, and then gave an interesting narrative on Amish history and how her Amish family lives: For example, they are educated through the eighth grade by Amish women; they use a horse-drawn buggy for transportation, but if the destination is a distance away, the Amish will hire a driver/car to take them there; although they don't usually have phones in their homes, Dr. Geringer's family has a business on their farm where a phone is allowed. Dr. Geringer is a guilter and brought several hand quilted Amish quilts to sell (at reasonable prices). What a treat this was!

Committee Reports: Book Bags – Brenda H. reported she has received several book bags but needs more. She has a pattern available for those who would like to help with this project. **Membership** – Due to unforeseen circumstances, the membership booklets will be delivered to members as soon as they are completed.

Dr. Susan Geringer: A Stranger in a Plain World

Dr. Susan Geringer was born and raised in Madera, California, and graduated from Madera High School. She received her Bachelor's and Master Degrees from California State University, Sacramento. She attended New York University for doctoral work, where she completed graduate research in New York's Costume Institute at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Susan completed her Doctorate in Business Administration at Henley Management College at Henleyon-the-Thames, England. After varied professional career, Dr. Geringer retired as a full professor and chairperson of the Department of Marketing and Logistics at Fresno State University.

Vice-President Janet Alexander in invited Dr. Geringer to speak to the Porterville Quilters regarding her experiences living with the Amish in north eastern Pennsylvania since 2016.

Here are a few of the insights Dr. Geringer shared about the Amish culture:

- In the Amish world, you are Amish or English, regardless of your ethnicity, culture, or background;
- The Amish also refer to themselves as the Plain People;
- Much misinformation regarding the Amish exists in general culture;
- The so-called "vanity block" in quilts does not exist;
- An 'English' can be accepted and become a member of the Amish if a person is over 30 and undergoes a trial period that shows the Amish the wish to become Amish is sincere;
- The old order Amish are the most conservative Amish;



"Rumspringa" (meaning 'running around') as portraved on television, means young people stepping away from the Amish into the English world in order to make a decision about taking adult membership in the church, has been extremely misrepresented. Rumspringa is more of a time of courtship. Young people are regarded as having reached maturity and ready to find a spouse.


