Our meetings in February are Feb. 14 & 28, from 9 am to 12. If you would like to stop by either to help or just to see what we do, please do. We would love it.



Meeting Minutes, January 19, 2023

President Sue Riley called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. followed by the flag salute.

Welcome/Sunshine: Jan reported we had 36 members and 2 guests present.

Welcome to Anna Diaz and Stephanie Bullock who decided to join our Club!

Recording Secretary: The December 15, 2022 meeting minutes were published in the January newsletter. Phyllis Taylor made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected. Georgeanne Borjon seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Corresponding Secretary: Diana read a thank you from the Family Crisis Center for our cash donation, We also received a thank you from the First Congregational Church for our gift of three engraved cutting boards for the church kitchen.

Treasurer's Report: Beginning checkbook balance: \$17,199.56. Ending checkbook balance: \$15,854.99 Difference: -\$1344.57. Brenda Amyx made a motion to accept the December treasurer's report and Lynette Stover seconded the motion. Motion passed.

VP/Programs: Janet informed the members of the programs and workshops scheduled each month for 2023, which will be published in the February newsletter.

Georgia Goode will present February's program on owning a quilt shop.

Following the business meeting, six Club members will demonstrate different projects on their embroidery machines. Lunch will be provided for \$6.00, and a signup sheet was passed around.

Janet also passed around the UFO forms (due in March) for members to fill out and keep track of their finished UFOs.

Committee Reports:

• Membership - Karen Ervin reported 2023 dues

- (\$40) must be paid by the February meeting, along with a completed Membership Form, in order to be included in the membership booklet.
- Cradle Quilts Lynette Stover reported book bags and doll quilts will again be made this year for local girls and boys. She thanked everyone for donating these items throughout 2022.
- Little Quilts Terry Gomez reported her ladies went through their tubs of yardage and made 3-yard bundle kits and other matching yardage kits to make 40" x 50" quilts. She encouraged everyone to take a kit or two home to work on. Batting is getting quite expensive, and she will put an article in the newsletter with Little Quilts' needs. Terry showed off a "quilt shawl" she made (and Cathy Proctor modeled) for patients in dialysis, Hospice, nursing homes, etc. to help keep them warm. Great idea!

Block of the Month:

Adela Rapp presented the January BOM, and reminded everyone for \$2.00 she will make copies of all the 2022 BOM patterns for anyone who asks. BOM kits are \$1 and just the pattern is \$.25. JoAnn Bishop won the drawing for the block presented in November.

Old Business:

- Best of the Valley -
- o Karen Ervin reported the 2023 show will be held Friday & Saturday, April 14 & 15. We will only need 10 docents this year. Quilt entries are due by February 14 and the finished quilts are due April 10. Karen explained entry requirements (which are also on the BOV website along with entry forms and other information). Diana McKay (and her husband) volunteered to take/set up the quilt at the Visalia Home Show, February 3-5. Karen Ervin will coordinate with the venue. Rusty Roots is coming up at the end of February.

o And, the name of our beautiful 2023 Opportunity Quilt is **Down the Garden Path!!!** Thank you to Sheri Cates, Karen Ervin, Terry Gomez, and Sue Riley for creating this year's quilt.

New Business:

- 2023 Proposed Budget After some discussion and explanation of a *proposed* budget, Becki Eaton made a motion to approve the 2023 Proposed Budget as printed on the back of the agenda and Ethel Quiram seconded the motion. Motion passed.
- Club Computer Jenny McKinsey brought up the need for a new, faster computer for the treasurer.

During discussion, Phyllis Taylor recommended spending \$400-\$500 for a new laptop. Ashley Cooper made a motion to approve a \$500 budget to purchase a new laptop for the Club. Jan McCusker seconded the motion.

There was discussion and Karen Ervin offered to give the Club her new laptop for \$500 and the old

Club computer, if it is compatible. Terry Gomez amended the previous motion to "approve purchasing for the Club Karen Ervin's new laptop for \$500 and the old Club computer, if it is compatible." The motion was seconded by Minnie Lansdale.

Ethel Quiram questioned the need to vote at today's meeting and do more research on purchasing a new computer.

The amended motion was tabled until February's General Meeting.

Jars: The jar prizes were "amongst the missing" and next month each table will have two prizes for the give away.

Show and Tell: Georgeanne Borjon showed her completed mystery quilt called "Which Way."

"Down the Garden Path"

This beautiful 2023 Opportunity Quilt was created by Karen Ervin, Terry Gomez, Sue Riley, and Sheri Cates. The top was created from a free pattern of Wilmington prints titled Hydrangea Dreams. The back was designed on a design wall by using leftover fabric and an additional panel. An edge to edge design was quilted over the quilt. It is a queen size quilt and is reversible.

Tickets will be sold at a variety of venues. Tickets are \$1 each or 6 for \$5. The drawing will be held at the December general meeting.


