

At the next meeting on February 15, a fabric sale will be held by Little Quits. The fabric was donated by Dr. Sampath, Sue Sampath's husband, when Sue passed away. The fabric will be organized in bundles, with yardage indicated on the package. The bundles will be priced at \$3 a yard (NOT \$3 a bundle). For instance, if a bundle has 8 yds. X \$3 a yard, the total price is \$24. You will not be permitted to break up a bundle or ask to cut the bundle into smaller pieces.

A few kits will also be available for purchase at a reduced price (vs original price). The pricing for this quilt shop grade fabric is very reasonable! Be sure to look for this sale!
