

Larry Joiner was presented a flag-themed quilt, made by club members, in appreciation for his military service during the 1970s. The quilt was presented to him on behalf of the club by Janice Poe.

Larry was a Navy seaman, a boatswain's mate, and a proud shellback aboard the USS Horn from 1970—1973. Off the coast of Viet Nam, the Horn's crew and Larry, shot illumine shells for 30 days, turning night skies into day so that ground forces could see. The ship visited places like Hong Kong, Tokyo, Singapore, and Bangkok for refueling. That gave Larry many opportunities to see the world. After six months, the ship would head home for six months, then head back to southeast Asia. Larry did that turnaround for four years. Larry is a pretty good artist and was selected to paint an insignia on the side of the ship: a dragon's head! Again, thank you for your service, Larry!
