Honoring Our Local Heroes: Capt. Robert Boulton, USAF, retired



Rob Boulton came with his city military banner, which has faded and so was taken down by the city. His memories and pride of service have not faded.

In 1971 Rob was teaching sixth grade at Olive Street School when he was drafted by the Army. With the help of an Air Force recruiter he went into pilot training as a Second Lieutenant. At that time, to be an officer, you had to train to be a pilot unless you were in ROTC or from the Air Force Academy. That was a six year commitment. Teaching and staying Stateside were priorities, so after five months of pilot training in Mississippi, he made the decision

to leave pilot training and was assigned to Titan II missiles and stationed in Tucson, Arizona.

There were eighteen missiles silos around Tucson and he was a Deputy Combat Crew Commander at the Alternate Command Post working 24 hour shifts, two or three times a week. The silos were deep under the desert and held two stage rockets capable of hitting any target in the world. After four years of service he was discharged in July of 1975 with the rank of Captain and returned to his teaching career in Porterville.

Rob is one of five generations of military service: Great, Great Grandfather, Civil War; Grandfathers and Grandmother (Army nurse) WW I; Father WWII (Pearl Harbor survivor, USS California); and Rob Vietnam War. He is proud of his own and his family's service in times of war and very grateful for the recognition given by the Porterville Quilters along with the honor of receiving their beautiful quilt.

The Porterville Quilters are proud of Rob and thank him, and his family, for their years of military service to the America.

The Parenting Network, Inc (PNI) and its member centers provide a comprehensive and proven approach to improving self-sufficiency for entire families, not just individuals. The centers are community-based, family strengthening centers that offer programs for all of Tulare County. The PNI encourages collaborative communities of practice, and provides

measurable outcomes of service delivery.

Representatives of the network, Flor Martínez and Billy Soto, presented information on the services offered to families in Porterville. Those services are varied and extensive and include a clothing closet and food pantry, youth and teen groups, parent-to-parent support group training, Early Start education programs, just name a few. Billy Soto offered a personal testament of the network's power to drive change. Mr. Soto participated in the Project Fatherhood program and took the training to heart in his life. He so believes in the training , he

has become a trainer for Project Fatherhood.

The speakers were invited to present the Parenting Network Inc. information to the club by Terri Gómez. Terri feels that club members need to know how some of the Little Quilts made by the quilters support the community. The charity quilts made by club members are given to families in need through the Parenting Network. In the last few years, the Porterville quilters have donated at least 100 quilts per year to local service organizations.

Vice President Challenge 2024

The Vice President challenge is a quilt project contest for anyone in the club to participle in. The VP coordinates the contest and determines the rules. At the end of the contest a winner will be determined by a vote of the club at the November meeting. A prize will be awarded for the favorite quilt project.

Rules for the 2024 Challenge

<u>Size:</u> the quilt project must be at least 36 inches by 12 inches. The project may be larger but not smaller. The project is to be finished with the binding completed.

<u>Design</u>: there must be at least one star pieced block pattern. The choice of the star pattern is up to you. You may include applique or embroidery but the focus of the project is to be the star pattern.

<u>Colors:</u> the project is to include traditional Christmas colors: Red, green, white, silver and, or gold. You may use other colors but only as accent pieces. You do not have to use all of the colors. If you use a pattern, please indicate the name of the pattern. There is no sign up sheet for the VP Challenge.

I thought that a Christmas theme would give you something to use at Christmas or to give as a gift.

The UFO (Unfinished Objects) Challenge is a fun way to encourage yourself to finish any unfinished projects you have. It is open to anyone in the club.
