

Analie Belden: Designer, Author, Quilter Extraordinaire




Guest speaker for the June meeting, Analie Belden, delighted Porterville Quilters club members with a brief history of the evolution of the Dresden plate block. She displayed examples of Dresden plate quilts made through many years up to modern Dresden plate quilts. With her sense of humor evident, Analie lectured but posed anytime she saw a camera pointer her way. She teasingly reminded her audience she is a published author and posed with her book a number of times. Analie reminded her audience that though she is known for her Dresden plate quilts, she also designs and makes other types of quilts, including landscape quilts, traditional quilts, and modern quilts. The following day, Analie taught a Dresden plate class at the Calico Mermaid Quilt Shop. She taught her students a method for appliqueing Dresden plates that emphasized accuracy. A great time was had by all!
