At the March meeting, club members played the Traders' Game. From the game, each participant traded charm squares with other participants. Quilters then selected ten (10) squares from the Traders' Game, a song from their high school years, and miscellaneous fabrics.

The challenge was to complete a project of your choice (an apron, wall hanging, child's quilt, etc.) of any size using ten (10) of the charm squares from the game. Each quilter was to Interpret their chosen song with the ten squares and any additional fabric needed. Each quilter had to use the entire 10 squares within the project, though they could be cut into smaller pieces.

There were no limits as to the size or nature of the project. Each quilter had to be able to explain how the project was an interpretation of the chosen song or how the song related to the project.


