# Timely Tips: Let us hear you and see you



How to use a microphone—in order for your audience to hear you clearly while speaking using a microphone, try

- Holding the microphone about 2-3 inches from your mouth. Think of eating an ice cream cone: keep the microphone in front of your mouth as if you're going to take a bite of it.
- When you turn your head, turn the microphone with you. Keep it in front of you, otherwise your voice fades.

- Displaying your quilt/wall hanging by standing in next to it; don't be shy of cuddling it, and

# **Quilts for Local Heroes**



Jean Loscotoff, a Porterville Quilters member, nominated Mr. George Sell to receive a quilt to honor his service to America. Mr. Sell, and his wife Barbara, attended the September meeting to personally thank the club for the quilt (though he had already sent a 'thank you' card).

Mr. Sell shared that he served in the U.S. Army from 1965 to 1968 and in Vietnam from 1967-68. After his service in the Army, he worked in public service for Tulare County. "I've spent my whole life doing for others," he said. "I truly appreciate someone doing something special for me."

Before the meeting, Mr. Sell met Sally Castillo, who made the quilt given to him. Sally donated the quilt to the Local Heroes program.

Helen Landeros nominated and delivered a Local Heroes quilt to Mr. Charles Grayson. Mr. Grayson serviced with the U.S. Marine Corps from 1967 to 1970. During his service he worked in Vietnam as an engineer and helped keep Highway 1A open. The Highway was (and is still) the main north-south route in Vietnam and played an important role in the war. Helen stated that Mr. Grayson "teared up" upon receiving the quilt.


