



Supply List

Main fabric 3/4 yard (outside) Lining fabric 1 yd. (inside & straps) Fusible web 2 1/4 yds.

Cutting the Fabric

Main fabric:

Cut 2 - 13"x16" pieces (outside)

Cut 1 - 9"x42" pieces (sides & bottom

<u>Lining:</u>

Cut 2 - 13"x16" pieces (outside)

Cut 1 - 9"x42" (sides & bottom)

Cut 2 - 4 1/2"x42" pieces (handles)

Preparing the Fabric

According to the fusible web instructions:

Apply the fusible web to the wrong side of each main fabric pieces (2) and

the 2 straps.

Remove the paper and fuse the main fabric pieces to the matching lining pieces, wrong sides together.

You should have to outside pieces, 2 sides & bottom pieces and 1 strap.

"Let's Paint a Barn Quilt" Workshop

Our November workshop will be very unique. You won't need your sewing machine, as you will be painting a quilt block! We are lucky to get Suzi Parron to give our November meeting presentation and hold the workshop the next day at First Congregational Church. Suzi travels all over the country giving presentations and workshops and has published two books. Her schedule is amazing, visiting 23 states this year.

Her website describes the workshop as follows:

"Join the barn quilt movement by creating your own painted quilt block. You will begin with a preprimed board and go through each step: drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail. The workshop lasts about 4 hours. You will leave with a finished quilt block or with one last color (which will be provided) to add at home. Ready for show and tell at your next meeting! The finished product will be twoby-two feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings."

Cost: \$50 and includes lunch and provided supplies (see below).

Supplies to bring:

□ Yardstick and/or 24-inch Ruler □ Pencils

□ Blow dryer (so your project will be dry to take home)

Provided Supplies:

- Pre-primed 2 by 2 foot board. The priming is a two-day job, which is already done for you!
- Suggested patterns ready to transfer (you may bring your own, but keep it simple, and be

ready to draw it onto the board).

- Paint & Foam brushes
- Colored pencils and other tools
- Coverings for tables & floor.


