
Local Heroes


Retreat Fun!

Editor's Corner



In the May Newsletter I discussed finger pressing and listed some tools you could use if you didn't want to use your finger or fingernail. I learned that one of the tools, the Point to Point Turner, can be used to crease fabric as a line to follow when stitching. The following photos show using a curved ruler to mark the fabric with a crease using the Turner, the crease after marking, and using my machine to stitch following the crease with my walking foot.

I was surprised how well it worked, and was pleased that I don't have to wash out the chalk, temporary marker or any other type of marking.
