## **Bags for Kids**

Make sure you have the an updated pattern for the bookbags made for kids. Brenda Head, committee chairman, said she has copies for you, if needed. Brenda also said she currently has about 45 bags, most of which she has made. She needs help in making at least 55 more. Brenda knows that members are very busy making items for Harvest Festival, but she would appreciate any help you can provide.

## Tip of the Month

Addendum from last month: Ellen Jordan gave us smaller measurements for the vinegar water so you do not have to make a gallon. She measures a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup of vinegar and adds water to make a full cup and then adds it to a spray bottle. So two cups of this recipe could be added to a 16oz spray bottle.

At the board meeting the members thought it would be a good idea to have a tip about ¼ inch seams. One of the most im-

portant skills is to master is a consistent scant ½ inch seam. There are several tools and techniques available for you.

- You can buy ¼ inch foot for your machine but they may not be accurate. You need to measure often while sewing to make sure you are achieving a ¼ inch seam.
- There are several measuring gauges at quilt stores and on line to measure your seam.
- Some quilters move their needle slightly to the right after measuring their ¼ inch in order to achieve a scant ¼ inch seam.
- Some people have even taped a small piece of cardboard on the plate in order to get an accurate seam. If all else fails you can draw a ¼ inch line on your fabric.

Cluck Cluck, an on-line shop, has a tape with measured lines you can place on your machine showing where to line up your fabric. Steady Betty, another on-line store, has a repositionable vinyl bridge which can be applied to your machine which also has lines to assist fabric placement.

Calico Mermaid also usually has these tools available.



## **Barn Quilts Workshop August 16**



You can still sign up for the August Barn Quilts workshop at our July meeting. The cost of the class is \$20.00. The cost includes an 18"x18" inch

board that has already been premiered, a pattern, Frog tape, and small containers for water and paint. You will need to provide your own paint, paint brushes (a 1 inch brush and a small artist brush), an 18 inch ruler or larger, and a pencil with a good eraser. We will discuss the supply list and answer questions at the meeting. Patterns will be available for you to choose which Barn Quilt you wish to make. You will be taught how to transfer the pattern to the board. Lunch will be provided.
