
November Workshop:

Forms to mark your stuff are on page 9 and available on our website: www.portervillequilters.com.


After the event, you will need to pick up any of your unsold items and dispose as you wish! After the meeting July 18 we will be having a workshop to make quilts for our Local Heroes project.

Editor's Tip of the Month - Flanged Binding

I have lost strength and dexterity in my right hand (and I am right-handed) so I really struggle to hand stitch bindings. So instead of hand stitching, I use my sewing machine and have learned to attach the binding with a small flange. If the flange is a contrasting color it gives a fun pop to the quilt!

It's not hard to do the binding and there are several You Tube tutorials on the internet to help you learn how to do it. My favorites are by Jordan Fabrics: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EB0r c76kVV4&t=14s and Missouri Quilt Company https://quiltingtutorials.com/tutorial/misso uri-star-baby-quilt-with-flange-binding.

And another great tutorial from Sewfresh: https://sewfreshquilts.blogspot.com/2015/ 01/flanged-binding-tutorial.html

Here is a quick description: Use the same

principles of 1/4 inch seams, going around corners and so forth as putting on a regular binding.

Cut flange fabric strip at 1.75 inches wide and the main fabric strip at 1.5 inches wide. Sew the same fabric stips end to end. Sew these long strips together lengthwise right sides together. Press the seam toward the main fabric. Press in half lengthwise wrong sides together (like regular binding).

Sew the binding to the BACK of the quilt with the flange fabric facing up and raw edges together, leaving a tail

to join the other end of the binding. Sew corners the usual way.

Flip the binding over the edge of the quilt so the flange

appears. Stitch "in the ditch" of the flange/main fabric seam trying to keep the sewing in the ditch on the back side as best possible. Maneuver around corners the same as the regular way to go around corners.

Here is a Christmas tree skirt I made using a flanged binding.


